In his book Axis Rule in Occupied Europe, Raphael Lemkin coined the phrase "genocide" denoting the deliberate and systematic attempt to destroy an ethnic, national, racial or religious group. Professor the Lord David Alton KCSG, KCMCO is but one of a number of significant patrons of Coalition for Genocide Response, which describes itself as a non-governmental, non-political human rights coalition-building organisation that works towards a comprehensive response to genocide and other international crimes. Think, Pray, Act

Think: Hitler felt that the world had forgotten the Armenian Genocide which reached its apex in 1915, resulting in the deaths of approximately 1.5 million Armenians, Assyrians and Pontic Greeks. Such international insouciance led to too little done to prevent the Holocaust in WWII, resulting in the deaths of 6 million Jews and many other minorities. The 90s also saw the horrors of the Rwandan Genocide. What would you expect your government to do to halt genocide? **Pray:** that God the Father, through His Son Jesus Christ, may inspire you by the power of the Holy Spirit to be a voice for the voiceless.
