According to the Guardian newspaper, one person in every eight in the UK will go hungry but the average household wastes approximately £700 worth of food every year. The problems of food (over) production and (under) distribution have certainly been highlighted during the current pandemic. Christians are called to be good stewards of God's creation. As Pope Francis wrote in Laudato Si', "Humanity is called to recognize the need for changes of lifestyle, production and consumption". (#23)

Organisation of the month

FareShare is the UK's national network of charitable food redistributors, made up of 17 independent organisations. FareShare collects good quality surplus food from right across the food industry and delivers it to almost 11,000 frontline charities and community groups. FareShare insists that the food that is redistributed "is nutritious, in-date and good to eat." This is one way in which both food waste is reduced and those who are experiencing difficulties in putting food on the table may both be served.
