
First Reading: Ex. 12 - Br Ste

French Gospel Acclamation

Gospel: A reading from the Gospel John (Jn.13) Fr Gerry O



Bro Ante: It was Passover and Jesus knew that he was going to die. He had always shown his love in many ways, but now Jesus showed us how perfect his love was.

Fr Kieran: Jesus was sharing a meal with his friends but before they started eating, He got up from the table and took off his cloak. He took a towel, poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet.

Bro Ante: Simon Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?"

Fr Kieran: Jesus replied, "At the moment, you do not understand what I am doing, but later, you will understand."

Bro Ante: But Peter cried, "Never! You shall never wash my feet!"

Fr Kieran: Jesus said to him, "If I do not wash your feet, you will not have anything in common with me."

Bro Ante: So, Jesus washed the feet of all his disciples, knowing that Judas was to betray him.

Fr Kieran: When he had finished, Jesus put on his cloak again and went back to the table. Jesus asked his friends, "Do you understand what I have done? You call me Master and Lord. So, if I have washed your feet, then you must wash each other's feet. I have given you an example, so that you might copy what I have done to you."

Fr Gerry O: The Gospel of the Lord.

Fr Gerry O: Come now and take your places at this table, citizens of the kingdom, heirs to the riches of God's love, friends of Jesus, who is our peace. Beloved, let us celebrate with Jesus at the table of peace.

All: Let us eat the Feast with him.

Fr Gerry O: For now, nothing can separate us from his love.

All: And let us love one another well, for he laid down his life for us all.

Fr Gerry O: We remember that he longed to celebrate the Passover with his friends. He arranged for a meal, his last in this life. We remember that he gave them a new commandment:

All: Love one another as I have loved you.

Communion Hymn: 'Bread of Life, truth eternal; broken now to set us free'

Fr Gerry O: At this mass, we think especially of those invited to share the ordained ministry—through our baptism, we all share in the priesthood of Christ. Priests: For our part, we pray that we may always be attentive to your needs and never take you for granted. You, like us, need friendship and love, welcome and a sense of belonging, kind words and acts of thoughtfulness. We pray, also, for the priests who have wounded priesthood.

Everyone: Let us support one another during times of crisis. God our Father, we ask you to bless our Priests and confirm them in their calling. Give them the gifts they need to respond with generosity and a joyful heart. We offer this prayer for our priests, who are our brothers and friends. Amen
